WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

FOR

U.S. NAVY

NAVAL BASE POINT LOMA

SAN DIEGO COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region, (hereinafter Regional Board), finds that:

1. On September 1, 2002 this Regional Board adopted Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) for the U.S. Navy, Naval Base Point Loma (NBPL), and on November 13, 2002 this Regional Board adopted WDR for the U.S., Naval Base San Diego (NBSD).
2. During the November 13, 2002 Regional Board hearing for consideration of the adoption of the WDR for the NBSD, the Regional Board modified the WDR at the request of the U.S. Navy. The modifications included removing the requirement for anticipated storm event inspections and changing the number of dry weather days for visual observations and for sample collection from 3 days to 7 days.
3. By letter dated November 18, 2002, the U.S. Navy asked that the WDR for the NBPL be amended to include the modifications, which the Regional Board made to the WDR for the NBSD.
4. This Addendum will incorporate the modifications made by the Regional Board to the WDR for the NBSD into the WDR for the NBPL.
5. This Regional Board has notified the discharger and all known interested parties of its intent to amend NPDES waste discharge requirements for the discharges of waste from the NBPL.

6. This Regional Board has, at a public meeting, heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge of wastes from the U.S. Navy, NBPL Complex, to San Diego Bay or surface waters of the State

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED**, that the *U.S. Navy* (hereinafter discharger), in order to meet the provisions contained in Division 7 of the California Water Code (CWC) and regulations adopted thereunder, and the provisions of the Clean Water Act (CWA) and the regulations adopted thereunder, shall comply with the following requirements for discharges of wastes from the Naval Base Point Loma to San Diego Bay or other surface waters of the State:

- A. *On page M-12 of Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) No. R9-2002-0002 replace Storm Water Discharges and Other Visual Observation 7.a. with the following:*

7. **Storm Water Discharges and Other Visual Observations**

- a. The discharger shall visually observe storm water discharges from the first qualifying storm event in each month of the wet season (October 1 through May 31). These visual observations shall occur at all discharge locations during the first hour of discharge. The first qualifying storm event is one that begins producing storm water discharge during daylight scheduled facility operating hours, and is preceded by at least 7 days of dry weather.

- B. *On page M-12 of MRP No. R9-2002-0002 delete Storm Water Discharges and Other Visual Observation 7.f.*

- C. *On page M-13 of MRP No. R9-2002-0002 replace Sampling and Analysis 8.b. with the following:*

8. **Sampling and Analysis**

- b. Sample collection of storm water discharges is required only during scheduled facility operating hours and only when the storm water discharge is preceded by at least 7 days without a storm water discharge.
