The purchase and dedication of this property to natural habitat adjacent to the Escondido Creek will help in the protection of this valuable watershed. As you know, the Escondido Creek terminates in the San Elijo Lagoon, the southern border of the City of Encinitas. The protection of existing water supplies and the protection of coastal areas are both legislative priorities for the Encinitas City Council.
