RESOLUTION NO. 70-6

AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 69-58, ORDERING THE CITY OF DALY CITY
AND THE DALY CITY SCAVENGER COMPANY TO CEASE AND DESIST VIOLATING
REQUIREMENTS OF RESOLUTION NO. 68-66

WHEREAS THIS REGIONAL BOARD HAS CONSIDERED

INFORMATION ABOUT THIS DISCHARGE

1. This Regional Board adopted Resolution No. 69-58 on November 25, 1969, ordering the city of Daly City and the Daly City Scavenger Company to cease and desist from violating requirements in Resolution No. 68-66 at the Mussel Rock Refuse Site.
2. Resolution No. 69-58 includes the following:
 - A. Page 2, Item 3-F: "Complete backslope as verbally outlined to the staff by the discharger within two weeks after completion of Items A, B, and C above."
 - B. Page 3, Item 5: "This Regional Board states its intent to adopt a firm time schedule for provision of such drainage facilities as may be needed to prevent further violations of requirements."
3. The city of Daly City, in a letter dated January 16, 1970, provided a commitment and a time schedule to perform certain work relative to slope grading and surface drainage at the Mussel Rock Site.

RESOLVED BY THIS REGIONAL BOARD

1. This Board hereby amends Resolution No. 69-58, an order to cease and desist, in the following manner:

Amends Item 3-F, Page 2, to read:

In accordance with the details outlined in the City's letter dated January 16, 1970:

1. Complete backslope and other grading within two weeks after completion of Items A, B, and C above.
2. Complete surface drainage facilities within 60 days after completion of backslope.

3. Initiate program to determine groundwater levels and to evaluate subsurface seepage conditions after completion of refuse disposal operations at Site "B".
