ORDER NO. 82-11

AN ORDER AMENDING ORDER NO. 79-11

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR:

SAN QUENTIN DISPOSAL COMPANY AND CAL-POX, INC.
SAN QUENTIN CLASS II-2 SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL SITE
SAN RAFAEL, MARIN COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, (hereinafter Board) finds that:

1. This Board adopted Order No. 79-11 on January 16, 1979, prescribing waste discharge requirements for San Quentin Disposal Company and Cal-Pox, Inc. (hereinafter discharger). Order No. 79-11 contains a requirement that the discharger submit a site closure plan which conforms to Board Resolution No. 77-7.
2. The discharger has submitted a report, Revised Site Closure Plan, San Quentin Disposal Site, 1615 Francisco Boulevard, San Rafael, California, dated July 31, 1981, which included a Declaration of Protective Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions, and a letter amending the closure plan dated November 4, 1981. The amended report conforms to Resolution No. 77-7 with the exception that not all slopes are greater than three percent. Other factors of the site design compensate for less than three per cent slopes.
3. The closure plan referred to in Finding No. 2 calls for subdividing the closed disposal site into twenty-six light industrial lots. The Declaration of Protective Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions attached to the closure plan is designed to assure post-closure monitoring and maintenance of this site.
4. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to amend waste discharge requirements for the discharge and has provided them with an opportunity for a public hearing and an opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations.
5. The Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.
6. This project involves the continued operation of a privately owned Class II-2 facility with minor alteration to the land. Consequently, this project will not have a significant effect on the environment based upon the exemption provided in Section 15101, Title 14, California Administrative Code.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT San Quentin Disposal Company and Cal-Pox, Inc. shall comply with the following and the following shall be added to Order No. 79-11 as Section D:

"D. Site Closure Specifications

1. This site shall continue to be operated and its closure completed in compliance with this Board's Resolution No. 77-7 and in accordance with the report, Revised Site Closure Plan, San Quentin Disposal Site, 1615 Francisco Boulevard, San Rafael, California, dated July 31, 1981, as amended by a November 4, 1981 letter from the discharger to the Board.
2. Post-closure monitoring and maintenance of this site shall be the responsibility of the discharger. The Board may amend these requirements to include individual lot owners and/or the owner's committee referred to in Appendix A of the closure plan noted in Finding No. 2 above, if the disposal site is subdivided.
3. Any revision of the closure plan shall be approved by the Board.
4. When the disposal site, or any portion thereof, is sold a letter shall be submitted to the Board indicating that the buyer is aware of, and agrees to comply with, waste discharge requirements applicable to this site. The letter shall be submitted by the discharger and shall be signed by both the buyer and seller."
