ORDER NO. 85-129

RESCINDING WASTEWATER RECLAMATION REQUIREMENTS FOR:


CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO
SAN FRANCISCO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT
SAN MATEO COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (hereinafter Board) finds that:

1. Water Code Section 13263 (e) and the State Board's regulations (Title 23, CAC Section 2232.2) require the Board to review waste discharge requirements periodically and determine if the requirements are adequate or necessary.
2. In May 1977, the Board adopted Order No. 77-48 prescribing requirements for San Francisco International Airport's (hereinafter discharger) use of secondary effluent for the purposes of landscape irrigation, dust control and earth compaction at various construction sites within the airport's property.
3. Since 1978, the discharger has not used or sold any reclaimed wastewater, nor are there any plans to do so in the future.
4. This Order will rescind the requirements which permit the discharger to reclaim wastewater. Adoption of this Order is exempt from provisions of Chapter 3 (commencing with Section 21100) of Division 13 of the Public Resources Code (CEQA) pursuant to Section 13389 of the California Water Code.
5. The discharger and interested agencies and persons have been notified of the Board's intent to rescind requirements permitting the discharger to reclaim wastewater, and have been provided with the opportunity for a public hearing and the opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations.
6. The Board, in a public meeting, has heard and considered all comments pertaining to the rescission of wastewater reclamation requirements.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT: This Board's Order No. 77-48 is rescinded.
