STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 2021-0026

APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLAN FOR THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY BASIN TO ESTABLISH A TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOAD (TMDL) FOR BACTERIA AT THE BEACHES IN PILLAR POINT HARBOR AND VENICE BEACH, AND TO INCORPORATE BACTERIA OBJECTIVES INTO THE BASIN PLAN

WHEREAS:

- On February 10, 2021, the Regional Water Quality Control Board for the San Francisco Bay Region (San Francisco Bay Water Board) adopted <u>Resolution No. R2-2021-0002</u>, to amend the Water Quality Control Plan for the San Francisco Bay Region (Basin Plan amendment), to establish a TMDL for bacteria at the beaches in Pillar Point Harbor and Venice Beach and to update bacteria water quality objectives for protection of recreational beneficial uses.
- 2. The San Francisco Bay Water Board found that the analysis contained in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) "Substitute Environmental Documents" for the proposed Basin Plan amendment, including the CEQA Checklist, the <u>Final Staff Report</u> entitled "Total Maximum Daily Load for Indicator Bacteria at the Beaches in Pillar Point Harbor and Venice Beach" and the responses to comments, complies with the State Water Board's regulations for the implementation of CEQA, as set forth in the California Code of Regulations, Title 23, sections 3775 through 3781. The State Water Board has reviewed the Substitute Environmental Documents for the Basin Plan amendment and concurs with the San Francisco Bay Water Board's findings.
- The San Francisco Bay Water Board also adopted the Basin Plan amendment pursuant to the "Necessity" standard of the Administrative Procedures Act, Government Code section 11353, subdivision (b). The necessity of the Basin Plan amendment is established in the Staff Report for the amendment.
- 4. The State Water Board concurs with the San Francisco Bay Water Board finding that the Basin Plan amendment is consistent with the Statement of Policy with Respect to Maintaining High Quality of Waters in California (<u>State Water Board Resolution No. 68-16</u>) and the federal Antidegradation Policy (40 C.F.R. § 131.12), in that it does not allow degradation of water quality, but requires restoration of water quality and attainment of water quality standards.

- The State Water Board finds that the Basin Plan amendment is in conformance with Water Code section 13240, which specifies that regional water quality control boards may revise basin plans, and section 13242, which requires a program of implementation for achieving water quality objectives.
- 6. A Basin Plan amendment does not become effective until approved by the State Water Board and until the regulatory provisions are approved by the Office of Administrative Law (OAL). The Basin Plan amendment must also receive approval from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA).

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The State Water Board:

- 1. Approves the Basin Plan amendment adopted under San Francisco Bay Water Board Resolution No. R2-2021-0002.
- Authorizes and directs the Executive Director or designee to submit the Basin Plan amendment adopted under San Francisco Bay Water Board Resolution No. R2-2021-0002 to OAL and U.S. EPA for approval.
