Justification

Information Supporting Selection as a Hot Spot (Attach additional photos as necessary):

The City of Fremont's Environmental Services Division conducts over 10 creek/street cleanups per year. As a result of these cleanups, the amount of pounds was counted during each cleanup and annually over time. This creek was selected as the top seven hot spots that contain the most trash present through either multiple or all the following ways: accumulation, littering, windblown, or illegal dumping.

The Irvington Creek Hot Spot receives trash by wind, littering, illegal dumping and accumulation. Upstream consists of the Laguna Creek Watershed where Irvington Creek, after breaking off from Mission Creek near Central Park, receives accumulative trash from retail businesses and various single-family and multi-family residents. With the nearby Irvington High School and a retail outlet, and with the direction of the wind, trash congregates in the Irvington Creek Hot Spot area.

Cleanups are conducted along over 800 yards of Irvington Creek that includes the Irvington Creek Hot Spot at least two to three times per year, and stays relatively clean from the continuous litter abatement through the city and community cleanups.
