

Existing Cleanup Efforts: Prior to its selection as a “Hot Spot”, there have been no existing cleanup efforts at this location.

Assessment Results if Conducted: Photo documentation was conducted on June 8, 2010 (photos attached). A complete assessment was not performed at this time. The trash observed at this location and documented in these photos does not reflect the typical migration and accumulation of litter. The majority of trash at this site is directly attributed to the alternative living quarters (ALQs) located underneath the bridge and alongside the arroyo.


