Site Information

Site Location: Bayshore Creek, north of Main Street and west of Bayshore Boulevard. Daly City's hot spot starts at the outfall to the open channel and proceeds 100 yards downstream, as depicted by red line on above photo (yellow line is a 100-yard channel segment contiguous to the Daly City hot spot segment that is proposed as a City of Brisbane hot spot).

Justification

Information Supporting Selection as a Hot Spot: Daly City, in all practicality, has no open channels and no creeks within its jurisdiction. This site is the stormwater outflow for a significant amount of both residential and commercial areas within the City of Daly City but resides within the jurisdiction of the City of Brisbane. The Daly City is also interested in using this location as a hot spot because there is an existing volunteer group who expressed interest in cleaning trash out of this channel and working to remove invasive vegetation. The City hopes to work collaboratively with the City of Brisbane and its residents to perform annual cleanups, as drainage into this portion of the channel is almost entirely from areas within Daly City's city limits.
