**SUBJECT**

CONSIDERATION OF A RESOLUTION APPOINTING CLEAN BEACHES INITIATIVE (CBI) TASK FORCE (CBTF) MEMBERS

**DISCUSSION**

Proposition 13 required the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) to work with the California Coastal Commission to ensure that funded projects were consistent with federal and state requirements. The State Water Board staff, through the Beach Water Quality Workgroup (BWQW), formed a panel of beach water quality experts to assist in project reviews. This blue ribbon panel, known as the Clean Beaches Advisory Group (CBAG) was selected from local agencies, environmental advocacy groups, academia, government, and scientific research organizations.

The CBAG was made official when AB 2534 (Chapter 727, Statutes of 2002) appropriated an additional \$46 million from the *California Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe Neighborhood Parks, and Coastal Protection Act of 2002* (Proposition 40) to the CBI Grant Program. AB 2534 required the State Water Board to appoint a CBTF that represents the "breadth and diversity" of California's coastal communities to review and recommend projects to the State Water Board for funding from Proposition 40. The CBTF has assisted the State Water Board in reviewing CBI project proposals, as well as evaluating the success of the projects, and identifying critical beach water quality research needs. Most of the members of the CBAG were appointed to the CBTF.

In November 2002, voters approved the *Water Security, Clean Drinking Water, Coastal and Beach Protection Act of 2002* (Proposition 50) authorizing the issuance of bonds to fund a variety of water quality improvement projects. The 2005/06 Budget Act appropriated \$23 million of Proposition 50 funds for CBI projects. Although Proposition 50 did not specifically require the appointment of a CBTF, State Water Board staff recommends continuing the CBTF to assist in the review and recommendation of project proposals and evaluation of project effectiveness.

The Division of Financial Assistance requested nominees for the CBTF from the coastal Regional Water Quality Control Boards, coastal County Health Departments, and the current members of the CBTF. Members of the CBTF may designate an individual to fulfill their CBTF responsibilities. The names of the nominees are listed below.

APPOINTMENT OF CLEAN BEACHES INITIATIVE (CBI) TASK FORCE (CBTF) MEMBERS

WHEREAS:

1. Proposition 50 authorizes the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) to encumber and expend funds for CBI projects from July 1, 2005, through June 30, 2010;
