Dear Chair Doduc:

In 2005, three agencies - the city of San Diego, the county of San Diego, and the San Diego County Water Authority - signed an MOU forming the Regional Water Management Group (RWMG) for the San Diego region. This group was established to work with governmental and non-governmental stakeholders throughout the region to develop the first ever San Diego Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (IRWM Plan), and to submit a Proposition 50 Grant Application. With the assistance of a Regional Advisory Committee comprised of 25 representatives from the key stakeholders involved in integrated water management planning, we have made tremendous progress towards the goals of Integrated Regional Water Management Planning. We will release a draft IRWM Plan in March, adopt the plan in mid-2007, and had expected to participate as a region in the Proposition 50, Cycle 2, Grant Application process.

Our agencies and our region are very troubled by the recent Department of Water Resources (DWR) staff proposal to summarily abandon the Proposition 50, Cycle 2, Grant Application process in favor of awarding grant funding to the nine proposals that were not selected during Step 2 of Cycle 1. We strongly oppose this proposal. The proposal is inconsistent with the November 2004 Grant Program Guidelines. The 2004 guidelines were prepared with extensive stakeholder input and clearly state that there would be two open and competitive funding cycles. Agencies have invested significant staff time and large sums of money in reliance upon these published program guidelines and schedules. Changing the rules of the program in the middle of the funding process is grossly unfair to regions such as San Diego and unjustly denies us of an opportunity to compete for these funds.

In addition, the San Diego RWMG strongly opposes any proposal to combine Proposition 50 and Proposition 84 funds. The funds must be kept separate, and the state must recognize the will of the voters in passing both measures. The process for funding must provide fair access for all regions of the state to both sources of funding, as has always been the stated intention of DWR and the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB).


The San Diego RWMG strongly urges DWR and the SWRCB to follow the established guidelines for distribution of Proposition 50 grant funding.
