## Storm Water Advisory Task Force (SWATF)

- Assembly Bill 739 (Stats. 2007, Ch. 610, Laird)
- Appointed at February 19, 2008 Board meeting
  - Resolution 2008-0012
- Expertise in water quality and storm water management
- 15 Members, with representatives from:
  - Public Agencies;
  - Regulated Community;
  - Nonprofit Organizations; and
  - Industry
- Task Force concluded June 30, 2009

### **SWATF - Scope**

- SWATF members helped develop the following documents:
  - Proposition 84 Storm Water Grant Program Guidelines, with specific emphasis on the project selection and evaluation criteria, and funding priorities
  - evaluating and measuring effectiveness of municipal storm water management programs undertaken and permits issued in accordance with Section 402(p) of the Clean Water Act

## Proposition 84 SWGP Planning and Monitoring Funding

How much funding did Prop 84 allocate to the Storm Water Grant Program?

- ~ \$90 million available for the SWGP
  - PRC § 75072 allows up to 10% (\$9 M) of grant funds but no less than 3% (\$2.7 M) to be used to finance Planning and Monitoring Projects
    - Only one round of Planning and Monitoring
       funding
       Page 10 of Guidelines

### **General Eligibility**

- Eligible applicants include public agencies, nonprofit organizations, public colleges, regional agencies, and State agencies
- All projects must be of regional and/or statewide significance
- Must be necessary planning and monitoring activities for the successful design, selection, and implementation of SWGP projects

## Proposition 84 SWGP Minimum and Maximum

■ Project Minimum - \$100,000

Project Maximum - \$1 Million

## Proposition 84 SWGP Funding Match

- Match requirement is 10% of total project cost
  - Eligible project costs dating back to the adoption of the Guidelines (February 17, 2009) may be used for Match

## **Eligible Planning and Monitoring Project Types**

- Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)
   Performance Evaluation
- Sediment-Bound Pollutants
- Industrial & Construction Discharges
- LID Barriers (Regulatory/Standards) and Solutions
- Plan/Implement LID at a Watershed Scale
- Storm Water Capture and Reuse
- Storm Water Capture for Groundwater Recharge
- Storm Water Quality Monitoring
- Engineered Soil Analysis and Nutrient Reduction

## Eligible Planning and Monitoring Project Types

- Development of a Hydro-modification Model Based on Field Verification
- Technical Assistance Team(s) to Help Local Jurisdictions Develop Projects
- Storm Water Program Effectiveness Assessment Tools
- Identify, Investigate, and Plan Abatement of On-land Locations with Elevated Polychlorinated Biphenyl (PCB) and Mercury Concentrations

- Applicants will be scored based on the Proposal Evaluation Criteria in Appendix F-3 and ranked accordingly
- Applicants who submit the most competitive
   Proposals will be recommended for award to the
   State Water Board
  - The State Water Board may also award funds through a directed action (Page 10 of Guidelines)

### 1. Applicant Type

- Public agency, nonprofit organization, public college, regional agency, or State agency
  - Further defined in Appendix J

### 2. Project Type (PT)

- Describe how the proposed project meets the Planning and Monitoring project types outlined in Section VI.F and Appendix F-1 of the *Guidelines*
- Describe how the proposed project is necessary for the successful design, selection, and implementation of the SWGP projects

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## 3. Problem Definition and Background

- Proposed research or project description
  - How is it of Regional or Statewide significance?
- Specific topic/question the project will address
- Project location maps/diagrams
  - Attachment 1
- Is the project part of a larger effort?
  - Explain objectives, framework, and scheduling of the larger project
- Describe previous studies or data collection efforts
   Attachment 6

### 4. Program Link

- How will your research/project support the purpose of the SWGP?
  - Will it implement projects that directly prevent and reduce storm water contamination of rivers, lakes, and streams?

### 5. Is the Research Likely to Be Successful

- Explain how the project will advance the understanding and management of storm water
- Explain the study design, including statistical reliability, controls, and ability to resolve confounding factors
- Describe any computer models, management practices, specialized testing, or extraordinary methods/materials
- Indicate expected research benefits to water quality and beneficial uses
- Will your results benefit other projects and/or areas?

### 6. Project Effectiveness

- Explain the anticipated research/project results
- What is the greatest challenge?
  - What are the benefits if the challenge is overcome?
- How do you propose to measure project effectiveness?
  - Project Performance Table (Appendix H)
  - Project Assessment and Evaluation Plan (PAEP)

### 7. Cost Effectiveness

- Describe how the match requirement will be met
- Does the project leverage any existing funds State, local, or other sources?
  - How much and from what sources?
    - How secure is each funding source?
- Explain how project costs were estimated and provide a reasonable estimate of cost for each work item
- Provide a detailed budget
  - Attachment 5

### 8. Readiness to Proceed

- California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) status
  - Status of all environmental documents required
    - All projects, even research projects, require CEQA compliance – typically a Notice of Exemption (NOE)
  - Attachment 2
- Scope and schedule of the research/project
  - Start and end dates with key milestones and potential obstacles
  - Attachment 3
- Describe the role and qualifications of researchers and key personnel
  - Commitment to the project

### 8A. Applicant Information

- Discuss similar projects successfully completed
- Receipt of previous funds from a State Water Board or Regional Water Board
- Terminated contracts, funds withheld, or audit with findings
- Current or pending legal challenges
- Grant agreement general terms and conditions

### 9. Bonus Points!

- Describe how the project will <u>directly</u> benefit a disadvantaged community or address environmental justice issues
  - Strong justification is required

## Planning and Monitoring Proposal: Tips

- Review FAAST Manual and FAQs
- Print out hard copy of entire application
- Remove formatting before cut & paste
- Review application prior to submission
- Save often
- Apply early to allow for any needed assistance
