NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

DRAFT STATEWIDE GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT FOR RESIDUAL PESTICIDE DISCHARGES TO WATERS OF THE UNITED STATES FROM VECTOR CONTROL APPLICATIONS (VECTOR CONTROL PERMIT)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) will hold a public hearing to accept comments on the proposed Vector Control Permit for residual pesticide discharges from vector control applications. A quorum of the Board may be present; however, no State Water Board action will be taken. The location and time of the hearing are provided below.

BACKGROUND

The Vector Control Permit for larvicides (<u>Order No. 2004-0008-DWQ</u>) expired on May 20, 2009, but remains in effect until a new General Permit is adopted. Order No. 2004-0008-DWQ does not cover spray applications of pesticides to control adult mosquitoes.

The proposed Vector Control Permit has been prepared in response to the *National Cotton Council of America v. U.S. Environmental Protection Agency* decision by the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals which requires that pesticide applications at, near, or over water must be covered by an NPDES permit if it will result in a discharge of residual pesticides to surface waters.

In November 2009, State Water Board staff posted the preliminary Draft Adulticides Permit, which covers spray applications of pesticides to control adult mosquitoes, on the State Water Board's website. Staff did not receive any comments. In February 2010, the Mosquito and Vector Control Association of California requested that the draft Adulticides Permit be combined with the requirements of Order No. 2004-0008-DWQ. Thus, the proposed Vector Control Permit covers both larvicide and adulticide applications.
