

Keys to Securing Brownfields Funding: Learn How to Access Funding for Brownfields and Environmentally Impacted Properties in Your Community

In order to make it convenient for those throughout San Joaquin Valley, we'll be making the presentation from Fresno Council of Governments and video simulcast to six other locations throughout the valley. This will allow for an interactive presentation. Please let us know which location you will be at.

Whether your organization has received funding in the past or is new to the grants process, this workshop will focus on how to competitively apply for state and federal grants that will assist with site assessment and cleanup, moving your projects toward the desired redevelopment outcome.

You will hear from US Environmental Protection Agency, California Department of Toxic Substances Control, State Water Resources Control Board and the Center for Creative Land Recycling experts about their respective grant guidelines. Topics to be covered include: overview of Brownfield Redevelopment, Applicant and Site Eligibility Criteria; Scoring Criteria; Application Steps; and Success Stories. Additionally, agency representatives will make themselves available at the Fresno location after the formal presentations for appointment-only one-on-one sessions for those with specific questions about their particular sites and situation (see how to sign up for one-on-one sessions below). If you are not in Fresno but would like to do this via video conference we will have a limited number of slots for this as well.

All workshops will begin with check-in from 9:30 AM to 10:00 AM; presentations will run from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Appointments for one-on-one sessions will begin at 2:00 PM.
