

Re: Land Spreading of Biosolids/Sludge

To Whom It May Concern;

I write my comments and direct them to the aforementioned issue. Does the science also pertain to Treated Sewer Waste being used for fertilizer on open lands in rural communities? My community of Herald has had an ongoing problem with odor, noxious fumes accompanied by headache and bronchial irritations from a local land owner who is using this treated sludge on over 3,000 acres next to our homes. What science can be provided to assure we and our groundwater are safe from this practice? The Herald area between South Dry Creek on the San Joaquin County boundary going North to the Consnmes River Basin which includes Laguna and Hadselville Creeks as well as Skunk Creek are the areas' main water recharge area for the South County Water Areas aquifer. I ask again; has any real study been done to discover if this is having an adverse impact on our water? When can we expect such a study? Can I assist in any way?

I think this concludes my comments for now. I appreciate the opportunity to make such submission on such a controversial issue for our community.
