



The Department of Water Resources is petitioning the State Water Resources control Board for a change in water rights permits 15254 and 15255 (Applications 16950 and 21443) to add a new point of rediversion. The water rights provide for the diversion and storage of water from Big Grizzly Creek at Lake Davis for application to beneficial use within Plumas County. The current authorized points of diversion and rediversion are Lake Davis and Grizzly Ice Pond on Big Grizzly Creek. The Department has a long-term water supply contract with Plumas County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (PCFCWCD) for the diversion and use of water appropriated under the above permits. PCFCWCD requested the Department approve delivery of a portion of PCFCWCD's State Water Project water at a new point of rediversion from Big Grizzly Creek approximately 700 feet downstream of Grizzly Ice Pond. The point of diversion will be owned and operated by the Grizzly Ranch Community Services District (GRCSD). The Department will release up to an additional 1.1 cfs at the Lake Davis outlet for the GRCSD diversion. The diversion facilities will consist of a screened intake pipe placed in the creek bed with a metering station near the intake location. The water will be used for irrigation of the golf course at the Grizzly Creek Development. Diversions will typically take place April 1 to October 31, depending on irrigation requirements. The project will serve a dual purpose of water intake during the irrigation season and wastewater disposal line from the Grizzly Creek Development during the winter months. The wastewater portion of the project is being constructed by the GRCSD and is separate and distinct from the petition for change. The GRCSD has obtained the necessary Section 401 and NPDES permits from the Regional Water Quality Control Board and a Streambed Alteration Permit from the Department of Fish and Game.

Under the proposed change, the Department will release an additional 0.7 to 1.1 cfs from Lake Davis for diversion by the GRCSD. Diversions at GRCSD will be metered and will be limited to the quantities released. There will be no net change in flow as a result of the new diversions. There are currently three other diversions from Big Grizzly Creek downstream of Lake Davis. Water is impounded at Grizzly Ice Pond downstream of Lake Davis for recreation purposes at Walton's Grizzly Lodge (510 West Main St., Grass Valley, California, 95945, 530-271-9577; P.O. Box 519, Portola, California 96122, 530-832-4834). Water is diverted under the provisions of water rights settlement agreements with the Department at two locations downstream of Grizzly Ice Pond. Up to 800 acre-feet may be diverted annually by the U.S. Forest Service (originally Jane Ramelli) just downstream of Grizzly Ice Pond (Contact information, Mark J Madrid, Forestry Supervisor, Plumas National Forest, U.S. Forest Service, P.O. Box 11500, Quincy, California, 95971). Up to 135 acre-feet may be diverted annually under the Valberde Agreement which is just downstream of the proposed point of diversion (Current owners: Grizzly Creek Ranch, Dave White, 5900 Grizzly Road, Portola, California, 96122, (530) 906-3952; and Dave Lake, P.O. Box 1421, Portola, California, 96122, (530) 832-4186). Diversions at the proposed GRCSD will not alter the quantity of water available for diversion at the other Grizzly Creek diversions.

The latitude is W39°50'0"N and longitude 120°26'0"W. The site is on the Portola quadrangle in Township 23 North, Range 14 East, Section 20 (T23N,R14E,S20). Water removed from the creek at the intake will be released from Lake Davis at the existing weir location by the dam (latitude 39°53.00'N and longitude 120°28'0"W) (T23N,R13E,S1&2). The project location includes Lake Davis and the creek between the Lake Davis Dam and the point of diversion

Project Description:

The intake pipe or delivery structure is an engineered T-screen and intake pipe (placed in the creek) and a check valve, 1 cfs variable pump, and metering station (placed in uplands away from the creek). The metered flow will be continuously recorded, and will at no time exceed the additional volume being discharged for the Plumas County Flood Control and Water Conservation District at the Lake Davis dam. The CSD is proposing to pump at approximately 0.7 cfs for the first delivery period, 1.0 cfs for June to August, and back to 0.7 cfs in September to a maximum yield of 250 af. This could vary in timing and flow; however it will not exceed four diversion rate changes per year and will not exceed 1.1 cfs.

The intake water will be pumped to a large pond within the development and used for golf course irrigation. During the off months (months when there is no water intake from Grizzly Creek by the CSD) the same pipeline will be capable of sending reclaimed water compliant with Title 22 regulations to Grizzly Creek. The Central Valley Region Water Quality Control Board has issued a Waste Discharge Requirement permit for this use of the reclaimed water.

A 4-inch discharge diffuser pipe and a separate 8-inch intake pipe with a T-screen will be placed in the creek. The pipes will be buried up to the point that they enter the creek. The two buried pipes will meet at a "Y" junction 10-20 feet from the creek. From there to the development, the intake and discharge flows will be contained in one pipe. The pipeline will follow an easement away from the creek to a pump and well casing, from there it will carry the water up to (or down from) the Grizzly Ranch Development.

Plumas County Negative Declaration #590 was approved for this project and no new environmental concerns were brought forth as a result of this project.

De Minimis Impact Finding

Project Title/Location (include county):

Grizzly Ranch Development, Intake Pipe Installation Project

The point of diversion is located within and adjacent to Grizzly Creek (also known as Grizzly Creek), approximately 700 feet downstream of the Grizzly Ice Pond dam. The latitude is W39 50'0"N and longitude 120 26 0 W. The site is on the Portola quadrangle in Township 23 North, Range 14 East, Section 20 (T23N,R14E,S20). Water removed from the creek at the intake will be released from Lake Davis at the existing weir location by the dam (latitude 39 53.00 N and longitude 120 28 0 W) (T23N,R13E,S1&2). The project location includes Lake Davis and the creek between the Lake Davis Dam and the point of diversion

Project Description:

The intake pipe or delivery structure is an engineered T-screen and intake pipe (placed in the creek) and a check valve, 1 cfs variable pump, and metering station (placed in uplands away from the creek). The metered flow will be continuously recorded, and will at no time exceed the additional volume being discharged for the Plumas County Flood Control and Water Conservation District at the Lake Davis dam. The CSD is proposing to pump at approximately 0.7 cfs for the first delivery period, 1.0 cfs for June to August, and back to 0.7 cfs in September to a maximum yield of 250 af. This could vary in timing and flow; however it will not exceed four diversion rate changes per year and will not exceed 1.1 cfs.

The intake water will be pumped to a large pond within the development and used for golf course irrigation. During the off months (months when there is no water intake from Grizzly Creek by the CSD) the same pipeline will be capable of sending reclaimed water compliant with Title 22 regulations to Grizzly Creek. The Central Valley Region Water Quality Control Board has issued a Waste Discharge Requirement permit for this use of the

A 4-inch discharge diffuser pipe and a separate 8-inch intake pipe with a T-screen will be placed in the creek. The pipes will be buried up to the point that they enter the creek. The two buried pipes will meet at a "Y" junction 10-20 feet from the creek. From there to the development, the intake and discharge flows will be contained in one pipe. The pipeline will follow an easement away from the creek to a pump and well casing, from there it will carry the water up to (or down from) the Grizzly Ranch Development.

Findings of Exemption:

Plumas County Negative Declaration #590 was approved for this project and no new environmental concerns were brought forth as a result of this project.
