**Figure 1: Pump Station Location and Pipeline Alignment**

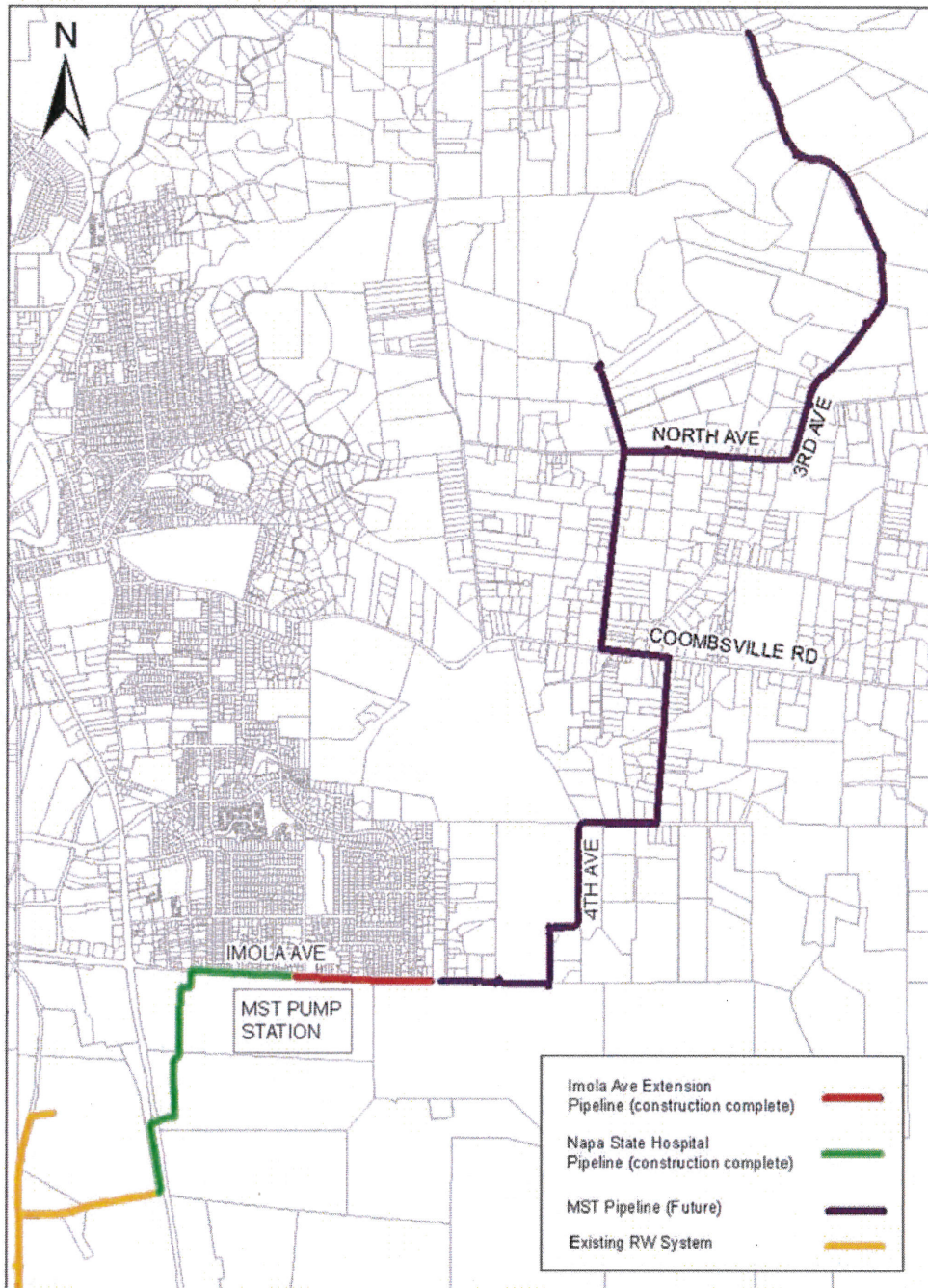
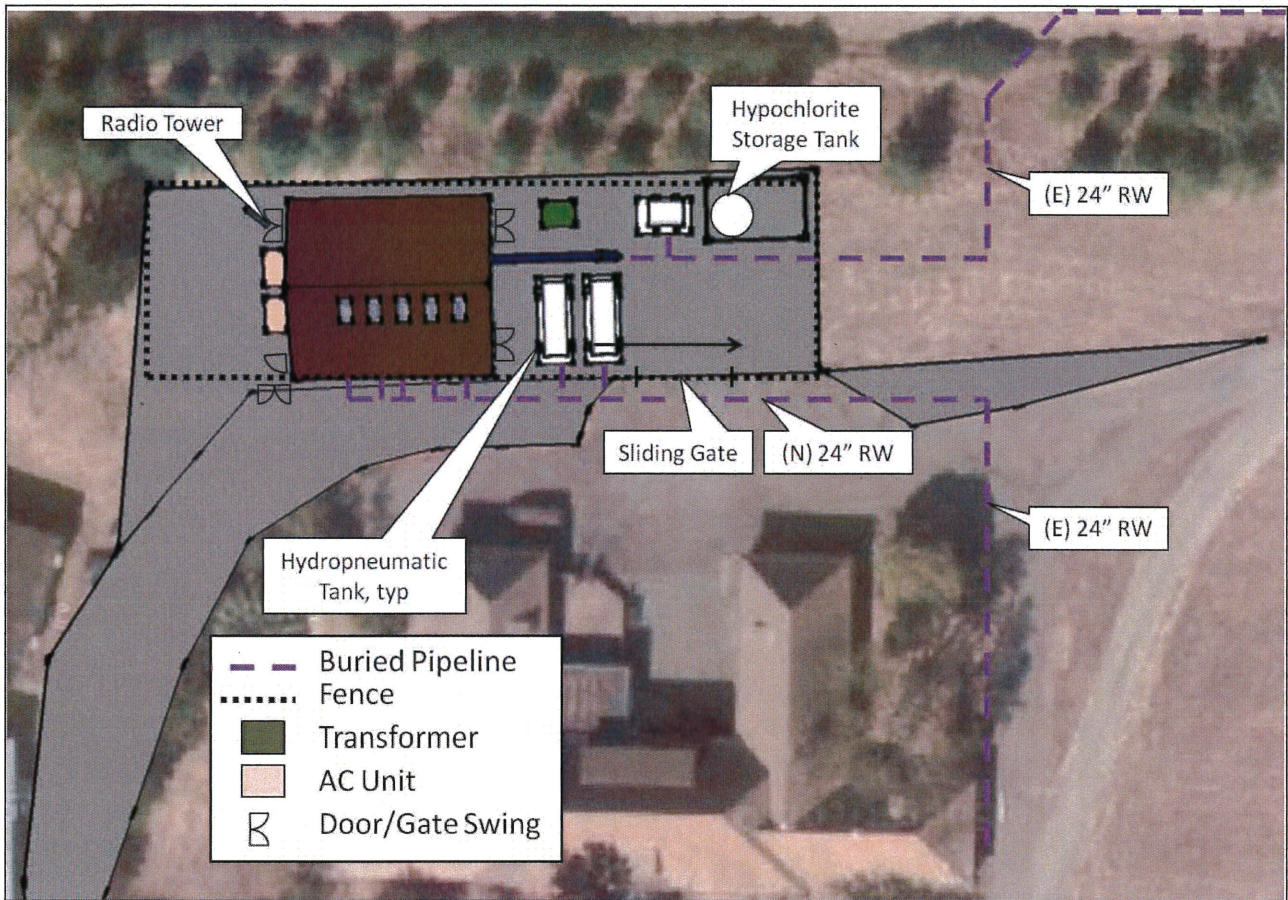


Figure 2: Pump Station Conceptual Site Plan
