NOTICE OF PETITION FOR TEMPORARY URGENCY CHANGE TO WATER RIGHT PERMIT 13776 (APPLICATION 18115) OF U.S. BUREAU OF RECLAMATION

COUNTIES: TEHAMA, GLENN STREAM SYSTEM: STONY CREEK

On February 24, 2011, the United States Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation, Permittee) filed a temporary urgency petition pursuant to Water Code section 1435 et seq., to extend the season of rediversion under their water right Permit 13776 (Application 18115). Under Permit 13776, water is diverted to storage in Black Butte Reservoir and rediverted at the Stony Creek Siphon into the Tehama-Colusa Canal. With the temporary urgency petition, Reclamation has proposed to increase the permitted season of rediversion for 30 days, from May 15, 2011 to June 15, 2011. The season of diversion will not be extended since the water to be rediverted is currently stored in Black Butte Reservoir.
