ATTACHMENT A

The primary objective of Pebble Beach Company in these proceedings is to assure that the Pebble Beach Water Entitlement of 380 afa is recognized in, and not affected by, any Cease and Desist Order issued by the State Water Resources Control Board ("State Water Board") against California-American Water Company ("Cal-Am"). State Water Board staff has previously and consistently recognized that the Water Entitlement of 380 afa annually granted to Pebble Beach Company and other fiscal sponsors of the CAWD-PBCSD Wastewater Reclamation Project is allowed to be served by Cal-Am with withdrawals over and above the 11,285 afa Carmel River withdrawal limit presently set forth in Order 95-10 (see letters from Edward C. Anton, Chief, Division of Water Rights dated March 27, 1998, and October 18, 2001, attached hereto as Attachments 1 & 2). The same provision should be made in any Cease and Desist Order that may be issued to Cal-Am ordering reduced withdrawals from the Carmel River.

Mr. Stilwell, Executive Vice-President and General Counsel for Pebble Beach Company, will testify as to the overall history, financing and operation of the Wastewater Reclamation Project and the granting and use of the Water Entitlement.

Mr. Niccum, General Manager of the Pebble Beach Community Services District, will testify as to the operation and performance of the Wastewater Reclamation Project in providing recycled water for irrigation of Del Monte Forest golf courses and open spaces, and improvements presently completed and underway to increase recycled water production and delivery to at least 800 afa and further reduce Carmel River withdrawals.

Mr. Fuerst, present staff member and former General Manager of the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District ("MPWMD"), will testify as to the history of MPWMD's involvement with the Water Entitlement and the binding commitments made by MPWMD with respect thereto.

Ms. Pintar, staff member of MPWMD, will testify as to the permitting, use, and accounting of the Water Entitlement.

Mr. Anthony, manager of Cal-Am, will testify as to Cal-Am's service of water under the Water Entitlement and commitments with respect thereto.
