

Please be advised that I support the staff's finding that there is water available on the Kern River, and that I further support the application by the City of Bakersfield to run available water down the riverbed. The running of water in the riverbed will replenish the aquifer for the benefit of everyone (city residents and farmers), restore the natural environment, and provide recreation.
