PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Battle Creek Salmon and Steelhead Restoration Project (Restoration) was created as a joint proposal by Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation), California Department of Fish and Wildlife, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and National Marine Fisheries Service, to re-establish naturally producing salmon and steelhead habitat on Battle Creek and its tributaries. The Project will complete the Restoration goals and re-establish approximately 42 miles of Chinook salmon and steelhead habitat in the north and south forks of Battle Creek, plus an additional 6 miles of habitat on its tributaries. Restoration will be accomplished primarily through the modification of the existing Battle Creek Hydroelectric Project, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission No. 1121 facilities and operations, including instream flow releases.

A previous water quality certification was issued to PG&E on December 9, 2008 for Phase 1 of the Restoration. The Project covers the remaining activities of the Restoration that were separated into Phase 2 due to Restoration scheduling constraints. Reclamation was issued a water quality certification on December 9, 2008 for the construction aspects of both Phase 1 and 2 of the Restoration.
