PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) requested a temporary amendment to the Pit 3, 4, and 5 Hydroelectric Project (Project; Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Project No. 233) water quality certification (certification) to reschedule the August 2020 recreation stream flows to October 2020. PG&E's 2020 outage schedule was modified due to COVID-19 and several unplanned and forced outages. For this reason, the California Independent System Operator directed that PG&E cannot take the Pit 5 Powerhouse offline to provide the August 2020 recreation stream flows. After consulting with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, American Whitewater, and State Water Board staff, PG&E is proposing to reschedule the recreation stream flows from August 8-9 to October 17-18.
