**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The Klamath River Renewal Corporation (KRRC) has applied for a water quality certification for the Lower Klamath Project (Project).

The KRRC is proposing to remove Copco No. 1 Copco No. 2, and Iron Gate dam developments (California dam developments) consistent with the April 6, 2016, Amended Klamath Hydroelectric Settlement Agreement (KHSA). The Project seeks to achieve a free flowing Klamath River that allows for volitional fish passage. The Project is located on the mainstem Klamath River in Siskiyou County, California. The KRRC is also proposing to remove the J.C. Boyle Dam Development, which is located in Oregon. The KRRC has submitted a separate water quality certification to the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality for the removal of the J.C. Boyle dam development.
